Time: 2 classes

Materials

- Original Works art paper
- Fine tip black markers
- Colored markers
- Watercolor paints & brushes
- Books and pictures of flowers
- Example of the project



Instructions:

<u>Day 1</u>


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- Discuss different kinds of flowers
 - Show pictures and actual examples
 - Talk about color contrast and relationships, shapes of petals, textures within the leaves and other aspects of flowers
- Locate and mark lightly, with pencil, the middle of your heavy white paper
- Outline the center of your flower. This may be done in pencil but must be covered over with black marker prior to adding color
- Now make 4 rows of petals
 - Plan the space so that the last row is near the paper edge, but not too close
 - Vary the shape and size of the petals
- Add the leaves
 - Start with outline
 - Add veins
 - Color them green
 - o Students can experiment with various shades of green



Instructions:

Day 2



- Color the flower
 - Using markers, fill in the petals
 - each row should be a different bright, bold color
- Select a contrasting watercolor paint for the background
 - using a brush and water, fill the background with a watercolor wash
- Add finishing touches
 - Each student should put their name on the front, in a contrasting color, away from the paper edge
 - make sure to record the student name, grade/teacher, and school, in pencil, on the back of the artwork
